



MOONSTONE DESTINATIONS YOSEMITE

Set aside as a national park in 1890, Yosemite has been described as “a grand collection of waterfalls, meadows, and forests that include groves of giant sequoias, the world’s largest living things.” Words, of course, cannot do full justice to Yosemite, and even the celebrated photographs of Ansel Adams can only hint at the natural majesty that awaits visitors. The **Apple Tree Inn**, just two miles from the park’s south entrance, is a comforting retreat for park visitors, as well as others pursuing a multitude of surrounding sights and recreational opportunities.
